

NZ Workplace Health & Safety Awards 2024: finalists announced

AUCKLAND, New Zealand, 8 May 2024

The finalists in the New Zealand Workplace Health and Safety Awards for 2024 have been decided. The winners will be announced at a gala dinner at the Viaduct Events Centre in Auckland on 18 June.

The awards are organised by Thomson Reuters, publisher of Safeguard magazine, and proudly supported by WorkSafe New Zealand and ACC.

Lifetime Achievement awards will be presented to long-time health and safety practitioners John Skudder and Mike Massaar for their early adoption and influential championing of new thinking and methods.

Since their inception in 2005 the awards have become established as the annual highlight for everyone involved in the prevention of work injury and ill-health.

Peter Bateman, Safeguard editor and convenor of the five-person judging panel, says this year's more than 180 entries demonstrate that even in challenging economic times, an encouraging number of organisations remain willing to explore innovative ways to better protect their people and, by doing so, help to create more productive work.
